The above officers (except Supreme Court Justice) have four year terms.

New Hampshire has three branches of government. The Legislative Branch, known as the General Court, is composed of the state senators and representatives; the Executive Branch includes the Governor, Executive Councilors and State Agencies; and the Judicial Branch is made up of the courts. Each branch of government is separate from the others yet has some control over and is controlled by the other two. This is known as a system of checks and balances. All three branches derived their powers from the State's Constitution and the Constitution is controlled by the people of the state.

The Legislative Branch is also known as the General Court of New Hampshire. It consists of two chambers, the House of Representatives and the Senate. There are 400 Representatives and 24 Senators, making the General Court the second largest legislature in the United States following the U.S. Congress. It is said that only the U.S. Congress and the English and Indian Parliaments are larger.

New Hampshire as a Republican trifecta and a Republican triplex. The Republican party controls the offices of governor, secretary of state, attorney general, and both chambers of the state legislature.
